What's new with 900 LRW

Since the last update, the 900 Committee has continued to work diligently to increase public awareness of this project and to assemble all the information needed to oppose it.

- On July 12, there was a **rally** on Lakeshore in front of the property and Richard's Memorial Park. Despite the blistering heat and poor air quality, this event was well attended with about 50 participants at any point in time. People came not only from LPEA, but also from north of Lakeshore, Port Credit and other city neighbourhoods. Motorists honked their horns in support, people wore green T-shirts and held up signs.

Unfortunately, none of the invited politicians (municipal, provincial and federal) attended.

- We now have a website which can be accessed at **900lakeshore.ca**. The website, designed by a member of the 900 committee, has allowed us to share information with a greater number of people. If you haven't done so already, you can go to the site to find some guidance about objection letter writing, as well as many aspects of this development which you may or may not know about. Knowledge is power!

Next step: the public meeting on July 28

- This is the first of two public meetings to be held with the City of Mississauga Planning Department. The developer will present their case for going ahead with the development of this site and the public is invited to ask questions and/or send deputations.

- We are currently preparing several deputations objecting various aspects of the development.
 - Attendance can be in person or online.
 - We need a crowd on site so the city knows that we care and that our councillor is clear about the wishes of his constituents and the negative impact that going against this might have on voting next year.
 - This is where you come in. Although the time is not the most convenient (1:30 p.m. on Monday, July 28 at City Hall), our efforts at trying to make this meeting happen at a time that was more convenient for public participation has not led to any attempts by the city to reschedule it. Therefore, it is what it is and we would like as many of you as possible to show up. You can wear your green shirt or not and, if you have any questions, you can ask them at the meeting. If you want ideas about questions to ask, we can certainly provide some.
 - If finding transportation is an issue for you, please let us know and we will try to arrange some carpooling.
 - There will not be a decision made by the Planning Committee on that day, as there are some reports that have not yet been submitted by the developer. It is anticipated that there will be a follow-up meeting this Fall.
